





#### **Police Services**


Policing Services are provided by 17 Royal Canadian Mounted Police members dedicated to policing the townsite under the Municipal Policing Service Agreement (MPSA) contract to the Town of Banff. There are also 2 provincially funded rural officers serving the area outside the townsite. Of the 19 members in the detachment, there are 13 frontline Constables, 2 General Investigative Section (GIS), 1 Detachment Commander, 1 Operations Non-Commissioned Officer (NCO) and 2 Corporal general duty Supervisors. The Town of Banff provides 4 municipal clerical employees that provide support services to the RCMP detachment. Scheduling is focused to enhance proactive late-night policing.




